RESOLUTION OF THE ATLANTIC COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE RENEWAL AGREEMENT #3 WITH THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC FOR THE PURPOSES OF ACCEPTING FUNDING FOR CERTAIN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR THE DISBURSEMENT OF SAID FUNDS; ALL FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN

WHEREAS, the Atlantic County Improvement Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority") is a political subdivision of the State of New Jersey and an instrumentality of the County of Atlantic (hereinafter referred to as "County"), established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:37A-44 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:37A-54, the Authority is empowered to undertake the necessary measures in the planning, initiating and carrying out redevelopment projects for the elimination, and for the prevention of the development or spread of blighted, deteriorated or deteriorating areas; and to provide assistance and take such other measures so as to provide decent, safe and sanitary dwelling units for persons of low and moderate income residents; to improve, further, and promote the tourist industries and recreational attractiveness of the County through the planning, acquisition, construction, improvement, management and operation of facilities for the recreation and entertainment of the public; and to promote the overall economic development and redevelopment of the area which it serves; and

WHEREAS, the County of Atlantic has taken a leadership role in the development of economic development initiatives for the County, including initiatives relative to the National Aerospace Research & Technology Park; and

WHEREAS, on March 29, 2016, the County and the ACIA entered into an Agreement concerning funding for economic development and redevelopment initiatives (the "Agreement" hereinafter) whereby funds are paid to the ACIA to assist with economic development and redevelopment initiatives undertaken by the Atlantic County Economic Alliance (the "ACEA") and the National Aerospace Technology Park, Inc., (the "NARTP"); and

WHEREAS, the County and the ACIA entered into a first renewal agreement on April 13, 2020, and a second renewal agreement on August 25, 2020, whereby annual funding totaling \$400,000 per annum has been allocated to the NARTP and totaling \$500,000 per annum has been allocated to the ACEA; and

WHEREAS, the County and ACIA desire to renew and amend the Agreement for a term commencing on January 1, 2026, and ending on December 31, 2030, as authorized by Atlantic County Commissioner Resolution #287, adopted on May 20, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the ACIA entered into Agreements with the SARTP/NARTP and ACEA providing for the disbursement of said funds provided by the County, which Agreements were subsequently modified by First and Second Amendments providing, *inter alia*, for extensions of the funding provided and the ACIA now desires to enter into a Third Amendment with both the NARTP and ACEA further extending funding through December 30, 2030.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of the Atlantic County Improvement Authority as follows:

1. That the Executive Director shall be and is hereby authorized execute the extension of the Agreement with the County whereby the Authority shall accept funding from the County in the

amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) annually, in installments commencing January 1, 2026, for a period of five (5) years to fund the Atlantic County Economic Alliance; and

- 2. That pursuant to the extension of the Agreement the Authority shall also receive the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) annually, in installments commencing January 1, 2026, for a period of five (5) years to fund the National Aviation Research and Technology Park; and
- 3. Funding shall be paid in installments by the County to the Authority on or about February 1st, May 1st, August 1st, and November 1st of each year; and
- 4. Authorizing the Executive Director to enter into a Third Amendment to the existing Agreements so as to provide for additional funding to the NARTP and ACEA consistent with the funding to be provided by the County; and
- 5. All other terms and conditions of the aforementioned Agreements shall remain in full force and effect.
